Method: SAT-IOP services are provided at Bellefaire's main campus, or at a Bellefaire satellite office.

Description: SAT-IOP provides intensive outpatient programming to adolescents who are experiencing substance abuse and behavioral problems. Our SAT-IOP clients often struggle with co-occurring mental health disorders that exacerbate, and are exacerbated by substance abuse. These mental health issues are an important consideration in our substance abuse treatment and are integrated into our IOP treatment curriculum as they impact the client's substance use and recovery. Services include a comprehensive assessment followed by the development of an individualized treatment plan that includes Group Counseling 3 days a week, weekly Individual and Family Counseling, Case Management and Crisis Intervention services whenever necessary.

Fee: Insurance, Medicaid, sliding fee scale.

Hours: 9:00-5:00 Monday-Friday (office). 24 hours/7 days on-call crisis services.
